" Pobleth This with Speed"

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing the said anonymous, treasonable, and threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote

the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof;
