Lifton, December 17. The King George Parket Boat came upon the Coast last Week in the Midst of very bad Weather; and not being able to make this Harbour, put into Setuval, from whence the Master sent an Officer on Tuelday the 9th Instant with the Mail.

The Fleet from the Bahia, or Bay of All Saints, confishing of a Man of War, an India Ship from Goa, and Nineteen Merchant Ships for this Place, and about Fifteen for Oporto, failed from the Bahia the 27th of August last. Those for this Place arrived on Tuesday the 9th Inflant: The Man of War brings about Seven Millions of Crusadoes in Specie. The Cargoe of the India Ship is not periodly known; but in general there is a Confiderable Quantity of Pepper, and some few Parcels of China.
