**T**HIS Republic has appointed Mess. Gian Lanfranco Grimaldi, Gian Baptiste Grimaldi, Christopher Spinola, and Jerome Durazzo, to be Deputies to compliment and wait on the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick on his Serene Highness's Arrival, and during his Stay in this City.

*Venice, January 17.* His Serene Highness the Duke of Wurtemberg is arrived here with the chief Part of his Court, consisting of above a Hundred Persons. He has taken and furnished four Palaces here.
