THIS Republic has appointed Mess. Gian Lanfranco Grimaldi, Gian Baptiste Grimaldi, Christopher Spinola, and Jerome Durazzo, to be Deputies to compliment and wait on the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick on his Serene Highness's Arrival, and during his Stay in this City.

Venice, January 17. His Serene Highness the Duke of Wurtemberg is arrived here with the chief Part of his Court, consisting of above a Hundred Persons. He has taken and furnished four Palaces here.

Pursuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the Twenty Sixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information has been sent to this Office, That on the 11th Instant the Ship Seahorse, of Newcastle, whereof John James was Master, bound from Cadiz to London, laden with Currants, Cream of Tartar, Spanish Wool, and Fullick, was wrecked near the Harbour of Old Grimby in Scilly, and entirely lost; but that some Spanish Wool, a trifling Quantity of Fullick, and some of the Ship's Materials, are saved.

Also, that on the same Day the Ship Expedition, of London, Richard Smith, Master, bound from Liverpool to London, with Salt and Potatoes, was wrecked near the same Place; that both Ship and Cargoe were lost, but that some Part of her Materials were saved.

Information has been received, that the Man en Frooe, of Viburgh in Russia, Daniel Burg, Master, from Bourdeaux to Hamburg; with Sugar, Wine, Coffee, Prunes, and Paper, was wrecked on the 10th Instant, on Melledgan, one of the uninhabited Islands of Scilly; the Master and Men were saved: But no Affidavit could be taken of the Circumstances as the Law directs, as the Master could not speak English.
