Naples, January 6.

ON the 13th Instant there will be a very brilliant Court, when the Nobility, &c. will have the Honour of kissing Hands on Account of his Sicilian Majesty being then out of his Minority. This Capital will be illuminated in a most magnificent Manner on that Occasion.

Madrid, January 12. On the 7th Instant his Catholick Majesty and all this Royal Family removed to the Pardo. There was a great Gala at Court To-day on Account of the Birthday and Majority of the King of Naples, when all the Chief Nobility attended, and the Court was extremely brilliant.

Berlin, January 17. We have had a great Fall of Snow here, followed by a very severe Frost, which probably will last for some Time, as the Weather seems now quite settled. The Want of Rain, since the Month of August last, has occasioned great Inconveniences in this Country, as the Boats from Hamburgh and other Places could not navigate for Want of Water, and are now froze up at considerable Distances from this Capital.

Vienna, January 17. The Empress-Queen has published an Edict, allowing the Soldiers in her Army to marry; and commanding the Civil

Magistrates, who formerly had Orders to prevent such Marriages, to facilitate and encourage them for the Future.

The Regiment, vacant by the sudden Death of General Macquire, is given to the Young Prince of Hesse Darmstadt, who arrived here a few Days ago.

Dublin, January 20.

Yesterday being the Day appointed for celebrating her Majesty's Birth-Day, the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix, were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollics from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, at the Castle, who appeared in extraordinary Splendor, to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices, before whom an Ode, set to Musick, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies: And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.
