*Constantinople, January 3.* The Prince of Walachia died lately of the Plague, and the Grand Signior immediately named his Son to succeed him; and appointed the Son of the late Vizir, who was beheaded at Meteline, to carry the Regalia to Walachia to install him in his Principality. These two Acts of Generosity and Charity of the Grand Signior are much admired here.

*Naples, January 20.* The Gala Days upon the 12th and 13th Instant, on Account of his Sicilian Majesty's Majority, were very brilliant.

*Venice, January 21.* On Monday Morning the 12th Instant, General Græme, a Scotch Gentleman of the Duke of Montrose's Family, and Commander in Chief of the Venetian Forces, died here, greatly regretted as a very able and honest Officer. On the following Day, Sir James Wright, His Britannick Majesty's Resident, and the rest of the English Gentlemen here, attended his Funeral. The Republick have made a Complimentary Decree to be sent to his Family, and have ordered his Bust to be placed in the Arsenal.

*Florence, January 24.* The Great Dukes and the young Princess continue well.

On the 20th, being the King of Spain's Birthday, there was a Gala at Court, and the Great Duke received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and admitted his Subjects to kiss his Hand, as usual on this Occasion, but did not dine in Publick.

The Marquis de Barbentane arrived here a few Days ago, and on Wednesday had his first Audience of the Great Duke, to deliver his Credentials, as Minister Plenipotentiary from the French King.

*Turin, January 28.* On Saturday last the 24th Instant, his Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick arrived in perfect Health in this Capital, and is greatly satisfied with the gracious Reception he has met with from his Sardinian Majesty, the Duke and Dukes of Savoy, and the rest of the Royal Family.

*Vienna, January 28.* On Thursday last a Courier arrived here from Florence with the agreeable News of the Great Dukes being safely delivered of a Princess. On Sunday the Court
