THE following Address of the Upper House of Assembly of the Province of Maryland has been presented to His Majesty: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty, The humble Address of the Upper House of Assembly of the Province of Maryland.

Most gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Upper House of Assembly of the Province of Maryland, beg Leave to present our unfeigned Thanks for the recent and signal Instance of your Royal Attention to the Welfare of your Majesty's American Colonies.

When we contemplate and compare their late distressed Condition and dismal Prospect with their present Situation, we admire the Wisdom and Justice of your Majesty's Councils, to which they are indebted for the happy Change; and our Hearts are filled with Gratitude to the best of Sovereigns for an Event so highly interesting, not only to your American, but also to your British Subjects, the Welfare of these Colonies and that of your European Dominions being absolutely inseparable.

We take the Liberty to assure your Majesty, that we shall, by our Conduct on all Occasions, endeavour to give continual Proofs of our Zeal, Loyalty, and Respect to your Majesty, and the Parliament of Great-Britain. With the greatest Fervour we implore of Heaven, that the Tranquillity now restored throughout these Provinces, the affectionate Regard of Great Britain towards her Colonies, and their Attachment to her, may be perpetual; and that your Majesty may long live to enjoy the Pleasure it must afford you, to see all your Subjects, throughout your extensive Dominions, perfectly happy under your mild, equal, and auspicious Government.

Stockholm, January 27. The violent Frost, which has already lasted above Six Weeks here and in Denmark, has so interrupted our Correspondence with the rest of the World, that we have To-morrow five Posts due from England; and it is supposed the Letters from hence will not have been less irregular.

Copenhagen, January 31. His Danish Majesty's Birth-day, who then entered into the 19th Year of his Age, was celebrated on Thursday last with great Magnificence, as was that of her Royal Highness the Princess Louisa of Hesse the Day following. The principal Promotions upon these Occasions were, the Post of Grand Marshal to Count Moltke, Son of him who hi-

ther to filled that Employment: The Balliage of Tondern, one of the most considerable in Denmark; to Count Holstein, who was to have gone as Envoy to the Court of Berlin; Count Goertz nominated to succeed him; and some few others of less Note.

An East-India Ship, which sailed from hence some Weeks ago, has been stranded on the Coast of Jutland, where she still remains blocked up by the Ice. We do not hear of any Lives being lost, or of her having received any considerable Damage,

Madrid, February 2. Count de Ricla, Viceroy of Navarre, and late Governor of the Havanna, has been appointed Captain General of the Principality of Catalonia, in the room of the Marquis de la Mina, deceased.

Hamburg, February 6. The Thaw has ceased, and since Yesterday it freezes very hard again.
