THE Hereditary Prince of Brunswick was to have embarked this Morning on board His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Montreal, but was prevented by the Wind being Westerly: His Serene Highness only waits for a Change of Weather to depart.

Some more slight Shocks of Earthquakes have been felt here this Week; and the Inhabitants are struck with such a Pannick, that several Thousands of them have retired into the Country.

Turin, March 4. Last Saturday Count Day kissed his Sardinian Majesty's Hand upon his being appointed Vice-Roy of the Island of Sardinia; and last Monday the Count de Viry arrived here from London, and met with a gracious Reception at this Court Yesterday.
