THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty, by a Land Tax, to be raised in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-seven.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act for giving further Time to His Majesty's Lieutenants, Deputy Lieutenants, Justices, and Clerks of the Peace, and others, for carrying into Execution certain Parts of an Act passed in the last Session, for Pay and Cloathing of the Militia; and for indemnifying such Lieutenants, Deputy Lieutenants, and Clerks of the Peace, and others, who have neglected to carry such Parts of the said Act into Execution.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act, passed in the Eighteenth Year of King George the Second, for repairing the Road from Sacred Gate, on the South-East Side of the Town of Helton, in the East Riding of the County of York, through the said Town, to Hull North Bridge, and for amending the Road from the present Turnpike Bar in Wyton Holmes, through the Townships of Wyton and Sproatley, to the Guide-Post in Flinton Lane near Humbleton Moor House, in the same Riding.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers, granted by an Act passed in the Eighteenth Year of his late Majesty, for repairing the Road from the Town of Kingston upon Hull, to and through the Town of Aulaby, and from thence to the Town of Kirk Ella, in the County of the said Town of Kingston upon Hull.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road from Spenal Ash, in the County of Warwick, through Studley, to a Street called Digbeth, in the Town of Birmingham.

An Act for the more effectual repairing, widening, and rendering commodious, the Highways within the Parish of Ealing in the County of Middlesex; and for lighting the Street in Old Brentford, within the said Parish, from the Turning towards Kew Bridge, to a Street called The Half Lane.

An Act for continuing the Term of several Acts, for repairing the Road between Wymondley and Attleborough, in the County of Norfolk; and for amending the Road from the End of the

Town Close, in the County of the City of Norwich, to the Chalk Pits near Thetford, in the said County of Norfolk.

An Act for rebuilding the Parish Church of St. Martin within the City of Worcester.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers, granted by two Acts of Parliament, of the Third of King George the First, and the Eleventh of his late Majesty, for enabling the Parishioners of St. Mary, Rotherhithe, in the County of Surrey, by certain Funerall Rates therein mentioned, to finish the said Parish Church, and for purchasing an additional Burying Ground, and to enable them to raise Money for purchasing the present Parsonage House, and converting the Scite thereof into a Burial Ground, and for providing a new Parsonage House.

An Act for the better and more effectual Maintenance and Relief of the Poor of the Borough and Parish of Queenborough, in the County of Kent.

An Act for building a Bridge cross Stonehouse Creek, from Stonehouse to Plymouth Dock in the County of Devon.

Petersbourg, February 25. On Wednesday last the Empress left this City, and went to Czarskozele, a Country Palace about twenty English Miles distant, from whence she set out for Mosco the next Day.

On Saturday last M. Gros set out from hence for Hamburgh, to which City he was lately appointed Resident from this Court. Count Gyllenburg, who came here some Time since to announce the Prince Royal of Sweden's Marriage with the Princess Royal of Denmark, set out for Stockholm this Morning; as did also M. Potemkin, one of the Empress's Gentlemen of the Chamber, who is appointed to return the Compliment.

Stockholm, March 3. M. Carlson, the President of the College of Commerce, died here very suddenly last Thursday; as did also Madame Palmfelt, the Lady appointed by the King to exercise the Office of Grande Governante to the Princess Royal in Madame Hierna's Absence.

Lisbon, March 7. The Hampden Packet, Capt. Braithwaite, which had been missing for some Time, was obliged, by Strefs of Weather, to put into Ferrol on the 19th of February, from whence she failed the 27th, and arrived here on Tuesday last the 3d Instant.

Their most Faithful Majesties and the Royal Family are expected to return To-day from Salvaterra to their Palace at N^a Sen^a da Ajuda.

The Baron de Haesten, Minister from the States General to this Court, having Leave of Absence, proposes to embark on board this Packet the Hampden, on his Way to Holland.
