Cadix, April 21.

LAST Week a small French Squadron came into this Bay: They are bound from hence to Saffie, and are commanded by M. de Brugnon, who is going with the Character of Ambassador from the Court of France to the Emperor of Morocco.

Several Transports are hired to carry a Number of Jesuits from hence to Civita Vecchia: They are to sail very soon under Convoy of the Spanish Ship of War Princeffa.

Madrid, April 27. His Catholick Majesty and the Royal Family removed to Aranjuez on the 22d.

The Baron de Stackelberg, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia to his Catholick Majesty, arrived here three Days ago, and will be presented this Week at Aranjuez.

Stockholm, April 28. M. Shack took Leave of the Royal Family last Thursday; and Yesterday Baron Juell had his first Audiences, as Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark.

Venice, May 1. On Tuesday last his Highness the Prince of Mecklenbourg Strelitz arrived here, accompanied by Baron de Dewitz, and M. de Goestell.

Copenhagen, May 4. On Friday the 1st Instant the Ceremony of their Danish Majesties Coronation was performed in the Chapel of Christiansburg. At Twelve o'Clock their Majesties, preceded by the Great Officers of State, those of the Household, &c. walked from the principal Gate of the Palace, on a Platform erected for that Purpose, to the Chapel, where, after hearing Divine Service, they received the Holy Unction from the Hands of the Bishop of Zealand. As the Kings of Denmark do not receive the Crown from any other Hands than their own, the Ceremony of putting it on is performed by themselves.

The Honours conferred upon this Occasion consisted of one Blue Ribband, given to Count Rantzau d'Aschberg, Father of him who now commands the Troops in Norway; the Naming Eight Knights of the Order of Danebroke, and Two Privy Counsellors, one of which was the present Grand Marshal.

The Duke of Glucksburg, and the Prince Emilus of Augustenburg, arrived here upon Occasion of the Coronation, at which they assisted.
