Turin, May 6.

LAST Week Lord and Lady Holland passed here, on their Return to England.

Lord St. John died at Nice the 27th of last Month. The last Letters from thence mention, that a Frigate and two Chebeques had sailed from Toulon for the Levant, in Quest of a Tripolitan Cruizer, who had plundered a French Ship, and murdered the Master and most of the Crew.

It is reported, that the Duke of Parma has lately published an Edict, which obliges all the Monks, Friars, and Convents in this State, to give an immediate Account of their Revenues, and Employment that has been, and is, made thereof, before a Delegate appointed for that Purpose.

Berlin, May 9. On the 7th Instant, about Three o'Clock in the Morning, the Princess Royal of Prussia was safely brought to Bed of a Princess, at Potzdam; and by the Accounts since received, her Royal Highness and the young Princess continue to be as well as can be expected. This happy Event was notified here the same Day, at Seven in the Morning, by the Firing of Cannon, and other Demonstrations of Joy, as usual.

This Morning the King of Prussia made a special Review of the Regiments of Lottum, Ramin, Steinkeller, and Rentzel, Infantry, and of the Regiment of Ziethen, Hussars, in Thier-Garten, without the Gates of this City; and To-morrow it is expected he will review the Rest of the Regiments that compose this Garrison, and then return to Potzdam. His Prussian Majesty seemed highly pleased with the fine Appearance of the Troops, who, at such Reviews, neither exercise nor manœuvre.

Paris, May 14. His most Christian Majesty and all this Royal Family are gone to Marli for three Weeks.

 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and
 Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commission
 and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are
