Westminster, May 20.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for raising the Sum of One Million, Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, by way of Annuities and a Lottery, attended with Amnities, to be charged on the Sinking Fund.

An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Duties upon certain Linen Cloth imported, and for amending such Duties, together with the additional Duties granted in this Session of Parliament, upon the Importation of Bees, or Straw, Chip, Case and Horse-Hair Hats and Bonnets, and certain Materials for making the same, to the Sinking Fund.

An Act for redeeming the Remainder of the Joint Stock of Annuities, established by an Act, made in the Third Year of His present Majesty's reign, in respect of several Navy, Victualling, and Transport Bills, and Ordnance Debentures.

An Act for redeeming One Fourth Part of the Joint Stock of Annuities, established by an Act, made in the Third Year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for granting to His Majesty several Additional Duties upon Wines imported into this Kingdom, and certain Duties upon all Cyder and Perry; and for raising the Sum of Three Millions, Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, by Way of Annuities and Lotteries, to be charged on the said Duties."

An Act for allowing the free Importation of Gun Powder, and Vermicelli, into this Kingdom, from His Majesty's Colonies in North America for a limited Time.

An Act for explaining an Act, made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, to prevent Wastage in Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and Bailiffs of Franchises, or Liberties, in Cases of Execution.

An Act to amend an Act, made in the Fifth Year of His present Majesty, for amending the Road from Chatteris Ferry, through Chatteris and March, to Wisbech St. Peters, from thence to the Gate, in the Isle of Ely; and from Wisbech aforesaid, through Outwell, to Deepingham Bridge, in the County of Norfolk; and for relating the several Acts for repairing the said Road, between Wisbech and March; and also for charging certain Lands in Cambridgeshire, and on the North Side, towards the Repairs of the Watersea and South Side Banks, which before the passing of the said Act were liable to such Repairs.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road leading from the Turnpike Road, in the Town of Tattersden, to and over Bull Green, and to and through the Town of Great Chart, to a House, known by the Sign of the Cat, at the Entrance of the Town of Ashford, in the County of Kent; and also the Road leading from Bull Green aforesaid, to Hotsfield Heath; and also the Road leading from Bull Green aforesaid, through High Hadden, to Dashmanden, in the Parish of Biddenden, in the said County of Kent.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road, from Shaddon Gate, near Carlisle, to the present Turnpike Road at Mulafide, and from a Place in the said Turnpike Road, between Binsey Aforesaid and North Raw Gate, to join the Turnpike Road at Skillbeck, in the County of Cumberland.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty ninth Year of King George the Second, for making a Road from the East Side of St. Matthew, Bethnal Green in the County of Middlesex, to the East End of Church Street; and to open a Way into Shoreditch; and for repairing, paving, and regulating Old Cock Lane, New Cock Lane, Church Street, and the Road on the West Side of the Opening into Shoreditch; and for removing Nuisances and Obstructions therefrom, and preventing the same for the future.

An Act to continue and render more effectual Three Acts, for repairing the Highways between Tyburn and Unbridge, in the County of Middlesex; and for amending the Road leading from Brent Bridge, over Trussell Heath, through the Parishes of Hamstead, New Brentford, and Ealing, to the Great Western Road, in the said County; and for lighting, watching, and watering the Highway between Tyburn and Kensington Gravel Pits.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act, made in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, intituled, "An Act for repairing the Road from Doncaster, through the Parish of Peniston, in the County of York, to Salter's Brook, in the County of Chester, and also the Road from Rotherham, in the said County of York, to Hartcliffe Hill in the said Parish of Peniston;" and for making the said Act more effectual, so far as the same relates to the said Road, between Rotherham and Hartcliffe Hill.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road from Marchwood, in the County of Denbigh, through Bangor, Worthenbury, and Hammer, in the County of Flint, to a House in the Possession of Thomas Jenks, in Dodington, in the Parish of Whitchurch, in the County of Salop, and from Bangor aforesaid, to Malpas, in the County of Chester, and from Redbrook to Hampton, in the said County of Salop.

An Act for establishing and well governing a General Hospital, to be called Addenbroke's Hospital, in the Town of Cambridge.

An Act for extending the Royalty of the City of Edinburgh, over certain adjoining Lands, and for giving Powers to the Magistrates of Edinburgh, for the Benefit of the said City; and to enable His Majesty to grant Letters Patents for establishing a Theatre in the City of Edinburgh, or Suburbs thereof.

An Act for making navigable a Brook, called Cudbeck, from the River Swale, to the Borough of Thirsk, in the County of York.

An Act for the more effectual draining the Lands,

Lands, lying in the Level of Ancholme, in the County of Lincoln, and making the River Ancholme navigable, from the River Humber, at or near a Place called Ferraby Sluice, in the County of Lincoln, to the Town of Glanford Briggs, and for continuing the said Navigation up or near to the said River, from thence to Bishop Briggs, in the said County of Lincoln.

An Act for improving the Navigation of the River Hull and Frodingham Beck, from Ake Beck Mouth, to the Clough, on the East Corner of Fishholme, and for extending the said Navigation from the said Clough, into or near the Town of Great Driffield, in the East Riding of the County of York.

And to Twenty-nine Private Bills.

Stockholm, May 5. M. de Breteuil set out last Friday Morning for Paris; and the Abbé du Prat is charged with the Affairs of France during his Absence.

Copenhagen, May 12. On Saturday the 9th Instant, their Royal and Serene Highnesses Prince Charles of Hesse and the Princess Louisa set out from hence for Hanau: They were accompanied as far as Rensfeld by their Danish Majesties and Prince Frederick of Hesse. As her Royal Highness is some Months advanced in her Pregnancy, it is thought she will return here early in the Summer, or remain at Hanau till the ensuing one.

St. James's, May 25, 1767.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That Mr. Alexander Gordon, Collector of the Customs at Ayr, in that Part of His Majesty's Kingdom of Great-Britain called Scotland, having been at Irvine on Thursday the 5th of March last set out from thence the next Day, on his Return to Ayr, in Company with Mr. William Herries, Merchant at Ayr, and John Mac Murtrie, Tide-Officer at the same Place; That, about Seven o'Clock in the Evening of the same Day, (the 6th of March) when the said Persons were near the Parks of Fullarton, there were, from behind a Hedge, Two different Guns fired at them, by which the Horse of William Herries was shot dead on the Spot; That, thereupon, the said Gordon and Mac Murtrie galloped away, and the said Herries was seized by Four or Five Persons armed, who expressed the most determined Resolution instantly to murder him, (supposing him to be the said Alexander Gordon) but, on being convinced by him of their Mistake, some of them rode after the said Mr. Gordon, but happily did not overtake him; That a Recognition of this Matter having been taken by the Sheriff of Ayr, it was discovered, in the Course thereof, that Four of the Persons, supposed to have been guilty of this Crime, have absconded, who, it is said, went on Board an Irish Ship called the Royal George, which, about the Beginning of April last, sailed with a Cargo at the Troon Point; and that such Smuggling Vessels from Ireland generally rendezvous at Rays, sometimes at the Skerries, and sometimes at Dublin; That it is highly probable, from the Evidence in the said Recognition, that these Four Men were concerned in the Design of Assassinating the said Mr. Gordon; and also that many more were in that Conspiracy against him: His Majesty therefore, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said wicked Attempt to assassinate the said Mr. Alexander Gordon, Collector of His Majesty's Customs at Ayr, as aforesaid, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon, and also a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually fired the said Guns, as above-mentioned) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; the said Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
