Malaga, May 8.

THE Princess, a Seventy-four Gun Ship, arrived here Yesterday with the Jesuits from Cadiz, in several Ships under her Convoy. Those of the Kingdom of Granada, who had been waiting in this City for some Time, were immediately put on Board others prepared for their Reception; and this Morning the whole Fleet, with between five and six Hundred of those Fathers on Board, sailed with a fair Wind for Civita Vecchia, under the Convoy of the Man of War.

Naples, May 12. La Chimere, a French Frigate of 36 Guns, arrived in this Port a few Days ago from Toulon, and has brought M de Chiseul, the new French Ambassador to this Court: Yesterday his Excellency had his first Audience of his Sicilian Majesty at Portici.

The Count and Countess of Kaunitz have taken Leave of this Court, and are returning home lately to Vienna.

Vicenza, May 16. Count Colourath, the Sardinian Ambassador Extraordinary to this Court, made his Publick Entry To-morrow, and will on Monday and Tuesday next have his formal Audiences of their Imperial Majesties.

Genoa, May 16. Two Barks, one Polacco, two covered Lighters, and seven Filuccas and Boats, with 316 Corsican Soldiers, intended for the Island of Capraia, sailed from hence the 12th Instant. This Detachment is commanded by Colonel Matra; each Soldier received a Present of one Zechin, to encourage them to behave well on the Occasion.

Florence, May 19. Letters just received from Rome mention, that an Express was arrived here from Civita Vecchia, with Advice, that fifteen Catalan Vessels, escorted by three Armed Schooners, were arrived there from Barcelona, with five Hundred and seventy Jesuits on board; the Pope, though with Reluctance, consented to their being landed, and ordered them to be conducted to Ferrara.

Turin, May 20. On Saturday the 16th Instant in the Evening, his Sardinian Majesty, with the Royal Family, went to the Venetie; where, as is said, they propose to reside about Three Weeks or a Month.

Berlin, May 23. Last Wednesday the Regiments of Prince Henry and Prince Ferdinand, the King of Prussia's Brothers, Prince William of Brunswick, Doringshoven and Wunsch Infantry, marched from their respective Garrisons into this Capital, and that of Young Prince Henry of Prussia, Cuirassiers, encamped, together with the Gardes du Corps, before the Gate of Hall; and on the 21st, 22d, and 23d, they, with the Regiments that compose this Garrison, viz. Those of Lottum, Zeunert, Prince Freder-

rick of Brunswick, Ramin, Steinkeller, Bulow, and Reutzel, Infantry, the Gens d'Armes, Cavalry, and the Regiment of Ziethen, Hussars, making in all about 20000 Infantry, and 2600 Cavalry and Hussars, were reviewed and manoeuvred on the Heights of Templehoff, about half a German Mile from this Place.

Dresden, May 24. The Court intends to remove to Pilsnitz for the Summer Season on the 1st of June.

Brussels, May 26. Yesterday Afternoon an Express arrived here from Vienna with the News, that the Princess of Saxe Titchen was brought to Bed on the 16th Instant of a Princess.

Hague, May 29. The Prince of Orange will make a general Review of the Garrison of this Place To-morrow Morning, consisting of his own Squadron of Life-Guards, Three of the Horse-Guards, and Four of the Dragoon-Guards, together with the Four Battalions of Dutch and Swiss Guards.
