*St. James's, June 4.*

**T**HIS Day being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock: There was a Ball at Court in the Evening; and Bonfires, Illuminations, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy, throughout London and Westminster.

*Lisbon, May 16.* Her Royal Highness the Princess of Brazil was happily delivered of a Prince on Tuesday last the 13th Instant, about One o'Clock in the Afternoon. Her Royal Highness and the Young Infante are as well as can possibly be expected. This joyful Event was immediately made publick by the Firing of Guns from all the Castles and Ships of War in the Port, and the Ringing of the Bells of the Churches and Convents; and the three Nights following there were Publick Illuminations throughout the City. Their Majesties the next Day received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers.
