On the 27th Instant, in the Morning, an Expres arrived here from Protzen, (a Country-Seat belonging to Madame de Kleist) where Young Prince Henry lay ill of the Small-Pox, with the melancholy News, that that Prince died on the 26th, at Eight at Night; fome dangerous Symptoms having appeared the Day before. As his Royal Highness was imagined to be out of all Danger, this Accident, being unexpected, was the more severe; nor is it possible to describe the Affiction of the whole Family, or the general Consternation it occasions here, as that Prince was extremely beloved.

Last Monday the 25th, the reigning Duke and Dutches of Brunswick sat out from Potzdam for Brunswick, the Princess Royal being in a fair Way of Recovery.
