Constantinople, May 2.

**T**HE Mufti has been deposed, and the Grand Signior has appointed another, who is an old Man, and has been Mufti twice before.

Berlin, June 6. Last Sunday Morning his Prussian Majesty returned to Potzdam, and on the 3d Instant sat out for Magdebourg, where he is to review the Garrison of that Fortrefs, together with the Troops assembled in that Neighbourhood, amounting in all to about Twelve Thousand Men. The King of Prussia is expected back at Potzdam To-morrow or next Day.

On Wednesday last the Queen of Prussia went to her Summer Palace at Schonhausen, where she will remain for the Season. Her Majesty was accompanied by the Princess Dowager of Prussia, Princess Wilhelmina, Princess Henry, and the Reigning Dutchess of Wurtemberg. Prince Henry and Prince Ferdinand, the King of Prussia's Brothers, are likewise retired to their respective Country Seats at Rhinsberg and Fredericksfelde, where they will continue for the Summer Season.

Dresden, June 7. According to Letters from Vienna, the Empress Queen is thought to be out of Danger, and a Day is already fixed for Singing Te Deum on Account of her happy Recovery.
