N Wednesday the 2d Instant a Bark arrived at Leghern with two Corficin Officers on board from Capraia, with an Account of the Surrender of the Fortress of that little Island to the Corficans on the 28th past, after a Blockade of an Hundred and two Days: The Garrison, which confilled of thirty Soldiers and two or three Offiers, had for many Days lived upon a small Portion of Bread and Water; fo that they were all much extenuated: They were treated with the greatest Humanity by the Corfican Offiers, and were permitted by their Capitulation to go to Genoa. Among the other Things that were found in the Fortress, there were four Pieces of Brass Battery Cannon and seven faller Pieces, with a large Quantity of Bullets, Powder, and other Military Stores. Hundred Corficins have been left in Garrison there: The rest were immediately sent back to Corfica.
