Florence, June 14. The last Letters from Rome take Notice, that on the 30th past a Third Convoy arrived at Civita Vecchia from Cadiz and Alalag:, confiding of Nine Vessels with 593 Jestits on board: They were escorted by a Spanith Ship of War, which was separated from them, and was not arrived at Civita Vecchia when the last Letters came away.
