The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Names of many of the Officers serving in the respective Regiments and Battalions of Militia within the several Counties in England and Wales, have been frequently returned by the Judges in the List of Persons proper to be appointed Sheriffs, notwithstanding such Officers are by Law exempted from serving the Office of Sheriff during the Time of their Service in the Militia: And whereas the Impropriety of such Returns has proceeded from the Want of Information being given to the Judges of the Names of the several Officers serving in the Militia, from whence many Inconveniencies have arisen: His Majesty, in order to prevent the like happening for the future, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby to Require and Command, that the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties in England and Wales, where the Militia has been raised and embodied, do cause Lists to be made every Year of the Names and Places of Residence of the Officers serving in the Militia within the respective Counties, and cause the said Lists to be delivered into the Hands of the Clerk of Assize, in order to be laid before the Judges at the Time of holding the Summer Assize, that Care may be taken for the Time to come not to insert the Names of any such Officers on the Roll of Persons to be proposed to His Majesty as proper to serve the Office of Sheriff.

Westminster, July 2.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Sinking Fund; and for applying certain Monies, therein mentioned, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and sixty-seven; and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament; for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of Money, which hath arisen by the Two Sevenths Excise; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation of any Sort of Corn, or Grain, Duty free, into this Kingdom, for a longer Time than is permitted by any Act of this Session of Parliament; and for

obviating Doubts in relation to the Meeting of Commissioners for putting in Execution an Act of this Session, for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax.

An Act for taking off the Inland Duty of One Shilling per Pound Weight upon all Black and Single Teas, consumed in Great Britain; and for granting a Drawback upon the Exportation of Teas to Ireland, and the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time, upon such Indemnification to be made, in respect thereof, by the East India Company, as is therein mentioned; for permitting the Exportation of Teas in smaller Quantities than one Lot to Ireland, or the said Dominions in America; and for preventing Teas seized and condemned from being consumed in Great-Britain.

An Act for establishing an Agreement for the Payment of the Annual Sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds, for a limited Time, by the East India Company, in respect of the Territorial Acquisitions and Revenues lately obtained in the East Indies.

An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Duties on certain Foreign Linens imported into this Kingdom, and for establishing a Fund for the Encouraging of the Raising and Dressing of Hemp and Flax.

An Act for restraining and prohibiting the Governor, Council, and House of Representatives, of the Province of New York, until Provisions shall have been made for furnishing the King's Troops with all the Necessaries required by Law, from passing or assenting to any Act of Assemblys Vote, or Resolution, for any other Purpose.

An Act for further continuing an Act in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to amend, and render more effectual in His Majesty's Dominions in America, an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

And to Two Private Bills.

After which His Majesty was pleased to make the following most gracious Speech:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

THE advanced Season of the Year, joined to the Consideration of the Inconvenience you must all have felt from so long an Absence from your several Counties, calls upon Me to put an End to the present Session of Parliament, which I cannot do, without returning you My Thanks for your diligent Application to the Publick Business, and the Proofs you have given of your Affection for Me, for My Family, and for My Government. And although, from the Nature and Extensiveness of the several Objects under your Consideration, it could not be expected that all the great Commercial Interests should be compleatly adjusted and regulated in the Course of this Session, yet I am persuaded, that by the Progress you have made, a solid Foundation

Foundation is laid for securing the most considerable and essential Benefits to this Nation.

As no material Alteration has happened in the State of Foreign Affairs since your first Meeting, I have nothing to communicate to you on that Subject. The fixed Objects of all My Measures are to preserve the Peace, and, at the same Time, to assert and maintain the Honour of My Crown, and the just Rights of My Subjects.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I thank you for the necessary Supplies which you have so cheerfully granted for the Publick Service; and my particular Acknowledgments are due to you, for the Provision you have enabled Me to make for the more honourable Support and Maintenance of My Family.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The great Attention which you have shewn to the particular Purpose for which I called you so early together, and the very wholesome Laws passed for relieving My Subjects from the immediate Distress which the great Scarcity of Corn threatened to bring upon them, give Me the most sensible Pleasure. I rely upon you for the Exertion of your utmost Endeavours to convince My People, that no Care has been wanting to procure for them every Relief which has been possible; and that their grateful Sense of Provisions so wisely made for their present Happiness and lasting Prosperity, cannot be so fully expressed, as by a strict Observance of that Order and Regularity, which are equally necessary to the Security of all good Government, as well as to their own real Welfare.

Then the Lord Chancellor, by His Majesty's Command, said:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

It is His Majesty's Royal Will and Pleasure, that this Parliament be prorogued to Monday the Thirty-first of August next, to be then here held; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Monday the 31st Day of August next.

Moscow, May 28. The Empress sat out the 28th of last Month for her Expedition on the Wolga. She embarked at Twer, and arrived at Yerossaff the 10th of this Month. To this Place most of the Foreign Ministers are gone by Land to pay their Respects to her Imperial Majesty.

Genoa, June 13. Two other Convoys of Expulsed Jesuits arrived at Bastia; but as that Port was not capable to contain the Number of Vessels, they were ordered and sailed for San Fiorenza.

Aranjuez, June 15. The Count de Colloredo, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Emperor and Empress Queen, is arrived here, and has had all his Audiences of this Royal Family.

Vienna, June 20. Prince Albert of Saxony has been indisposed for some Days; and it is now asserted that his Disorder shews itself to be the Small-Pox.

Dresden, June 21. The Elector, Electress Dowager and Administrator came to Town on Wednesday Evening, in order to celebrate, on Thursday, what the Roman Catholics call la Fête Dieu. There was, on that Day, a solemn Procession in the Catholick Church, in which the Electoral Family walked, besides other Ceremonies peculiar to that Popish Ecclesiastical Festival.

Hamburg, June 23. M. Sillem, one of the Secretaries to the Senate, has been elected Syndick thereof, in the room of the late M. Amfinck.

Brussels, June 23. Yesterday his Royal Highness and the Court went to Terveuren for the Summer Season.
