Foundation is laid for fecuring the most considerable and essential Benefits to this Nation.

As no material Alteration has happened in the State of Foreign Affairs since your first Meeting, I have nothing to communicate to you on that Subject. The fixed Objects of all My Measures are to preserve the Peace, and, at the same Time, to affert and maintain the Honour of My Crown, and the just Rights of My Sub-

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I thank you for the necessary Supplies which you have so chearfully granted for the Publick Service; and my particular Acknowledgments are due to you, for the Provision you have enabled Me to make for the more honourable Support and Maintenance of My Family.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The great Attention which you have shewn to the particular Purpose for which I called you so early together, and the very wholesome Laws passed for relieving My Subjects from the immediate Distress which the great Scarcity of Corn threatned to bring upon them, give Me the most sensible Pleasure. I rely upon you for the Exertion of your utmost Endeavours to convince My People, that no Care has been wanting to procure for them every Relief which has been possible; and that their grateful Sense of Provisions so wisely made for their present Happiness and lasting Prosperity, cannot be so fully expressed, as by a strict Observance of that Order and Regularity, which are equally necessary to the Security of all good Government, as well as to their own real Welfare.

Then the Lord Chancellor, by His Majesty's Command, said:
