PRESE N The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, "An Act for allowing the Impor-" tation of Wheat and Wheat Flour "from His Majesty's Colonies in America inco "this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of "Duty," It is enacted that it shall and may be lawful to and for any of his Majesty's Subjects to import into Great Britain, in any Ship or Vessel navigated according to Law, at any Time or Times before the first Day of August One Thousand Seren Hundred and Sixty-seven, any Wheat or Wheat Flour from any of H's Majesty's Colonisin America, without the Payment of any Sublidy, Custom, Duty or Imposition whatso ever, in the Manner therein mentioned. whereas by another Act passed in the said Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for granting "to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out " of the Sinking Fund, and for applying certain " Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and "Sixty-feven; and for fur her appropriating the " Supplies granted in this Seffion of Parliament; for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of " Money which hath arisen by the Two-sevenths "Excile; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit "the Importation of any sort of Corn or Grain, Duty Free, into this Kingdom, for a longer Time than is permitted by any Act of this "Sellion of Parliament; and for obviating "Doubts, in relation to the Meeting of Com-" missioners for putting in Execution an Act of "this Seffion for granting an Aid to his Ma"jelly by a Land Tax;" after reciting that it might be expedient, during the Recess of Parliament, to permit the Free Importation of the and Articles into this Kingdom beyond the Time lmitted by the faid Act for the Free Importation thereof; It is enacted, amongst other Things, that it shall and may be lawful to and for His blijeily, from Time to Time, during the next Recess of Parliament, (whenever it shall appear expedient to His Majesty so to do) by His Royal Proclamation to be iffued by and with the Ad-Council to be published in the London Gazette, to remit the Free Importation of the Articles cortlaid from any Parts or Places in His Ma-Times until the first Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-eight: And whereas it appears to His Majesty to be expedithat this Time, that the Free Importation of Wheat and Wheat Flour from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America Anud be further continued; His Majesty doth

therefore hereby Order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Free Importation into Great Britain of Wheat and Wheat Flour by any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America, in any Ship or Vessel na-vigated according to Law, from the Expiration of the Time limitted for the Importation ti ereof by the first mentioned Act, until the First Day of February, 1768, under the Regulations and in the Manner mentioned and contained in the faid recited Acts; of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.
