SENT, P R E The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, " An Act for allowing the Impor-" tation of Wheat and Wheat Flour "from His Majesty's Colonies in America into "this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of "Duty," It is enacted that it shall and may be lawful to and for any of his Majesty's Subjects to import into Great Britain, in any Ship or Vessel minigated according to Law, at any Time or Times before the first Day of August One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-feven, any Wheat or Wheat Flour from any of His Majesty's Colonisin America, without the Payment of any Sublidy, Custom, Duty or Imposition whatfoerer, in the Manner therein mentioned. whereas by another Act passed in the said Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out " of the Sinking Fund, and for applying certain "Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of "the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and "Sixty-seven; and for further appropriating the "Supplies granted in this Seffion of Parliament; "for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of "Money which hath arisen by the Two-sevenths "Excile; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit " the Importation of any Sort of Corn or Grain, "Duty Free, into this Kingdom, for a longer "Time than is permitted by any Act of this "Sellion of Parliament; and for obviating "Doubts, in relation to the Meeting of Commissioners for putting in Execution an Act of "this Seffion for granting an Aid to his Ma"jeffy by a Land Tax;" after reciting that it might be expedient, during the Recess of Parliament, to permit the Free Importation of the and Anicles into this Kingdom beyond the Time lmitted by the said A& for the Free Importation thereof; It is enacted, amongst other Things, that it shall and may be lawful to and for His Majesty, from Time to Time, during the next Recess of Parliament, (whenever it shall appear expedient to His Majesty so to do) by His Royal Preclamation to be iffued by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, or by his Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, to permit the Free Importation of the Articles aforesaid from any Parts or Places in His Ma-

AT the Court at St. James's, the 24th Day icfly's Dominions in America, for any Time of Times until the first Day of February One Thousand Seven Handson Control of Thousand Control of Thou whereas it appears to His Majesty to be expedient at this Time, that the Fice Importation of Wheat and Wheat Flour from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America should be further continued.; His Majesty doth therefore hereby Order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Free Importation into Great Britain of Wheat and Wheat Flour by any of His Majesty's Subjects he permitted from any Parts or Piaces in His Majesty's Dominions in America, in any Ship or Vessel na-vigated according to Law, from the Expiration of the Time limitted for the Importation thereof by the first mentioned A&, until the First Day of February, 1768, under the Regulations and in the Manner mentioned and contained in the fairl recited Acts; of which all Perfons concerned are hereby required to take Notice and governthemselves accordingly.
