SENT, PRE The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, " An Act for allowing the Impor-tation of Wheat and Wheat Flour " from His Majesty's Colonies in America into "this Kingdom, for a limited Time, free of "Duty," It is enacted that it shall and may be lawful to and for any of his Majesty's Subjects to import into Great Britain, in any Ship or Vessel navigated according to Law, at any Time or Times before the first Day of August One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-feven, any Wheat or Wheat Flour from any of His Majesty's Colonisin America, without the Payment of any Subfidy, Custom, Duty or Imposition whatsoever, in the Manner therein mentioned. whereas by another Act passed in the said Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for granting " to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out " of the Sinking Fund, and for applying certain " Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of "the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and " Sixty-feven; and for further appropriating the " Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament; " for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of " Money which hath arisen by the I wo-sevenths "Excise; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit " the Importation of any Sort of Corn or Grain, "Duty Free, into this Kingdom, for a longer "Time than is permitted by any Act of this "Session of Parliament; and for obviating "Doubts, in relation to the Meeting of Com-" millioners for putting in Execution an Act of "this Seffion for granting an Aid to his Ma"jelly by a Land Tax;" after reciting that it
might be expedient, during the Recess of Parliament, to permit the Free Importation of the faid Articles into this Kingdom beyond the Time limitted by the said Act for the Free Importation thertof; It is enacted, amongst other Things, that it shall and may be lawful to and for Hi-Majesty, from Time to Time, during the next Recess of Parliament, (whenever it shall appear expedient to His Majesty so to do) by His Royal Preclamation to be iffued by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, or by his Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, to permit the Free Importation of the Articles aforefaid from any Parts or Places in His Ma-

AT the Court at St. James's, the 24th Day jefty's Dominions in America, for any Time of Times until the first Day of February One Thousand Same II. Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-eight: And whereas it appears to His Majesty to be expedient at this Time, that the Free Importation of Wheat and Wheat Flour from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America should be further continued; His Majesty doth therefore hereby Order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Free Importation into Great Britain of Wheat and Wheat Flour by any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America, in any Ship or Vessel navigated according to Law, from the Expiration of the Time limitted for the Importation thereof by the first mentioned Act, until the First Day of February, 1768, under the Regulations and in the Manner mentioned and contained in the faid recited A&s; of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. By the KING, PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R. Hereas James Earl of Moray, and John Earl of Hyndford, were duly elected and returned to be Two of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of Great Britain, and are fince deceased; In order to the Electing Two other Peers of Scotland to sit in their Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy Rood House in Edinburgh, on Thursday the First Day of October next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose Two other Peers of Scotland, to fit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the faid James Earl of Moray and John Earl of Hyndford deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent, (such Proxies being Peers) and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witnesses, and both Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths re-
