THEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Pailiament, intitled, "An Act for allowing the Impor-" tation of Wheat and Wheat Flour " from His Majesty's Colonies in America into "this Kingdom, for a limited Tirne, free of "Duty," It is enacted that it shall and may be lawful to and for any of his Majesty's Subjects to import into Great Britain, in any Ship or Vessel navigated according to Law, at any Time or Times before the first Day of August One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-feven, any Wheat or Wheat Flour from any of His Majesty's Colonies in America, without the Payment of any Sublidy, Custom, Duty or Imposition whatsoever, in the Manner therein mentioned. whereas by another A& passed in the said Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for granting "to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out " of the Sinking Fund, and for applying certain "Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of "the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and "Sixty: seven; and for further appropriating the "Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament; "for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of Money which hath arisen by the Two-sevenths "Excise; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit " the Importation of any Sort of Corn or Grain, "Duty Free, into this Kingdom, for a longer "Time than is permitted by any Act of this "Sellion of Parliament; and for obviating Doubts, in relation to the Meeting of Commissioners for putting in Execution an Act of this Session for granting an Aid to his Maelly by a Land Tax;" after reciting that it mint be expedient, during the Recess of Parliment, to permit the Free Importation of the Aricles into this Kingdom beyond the Time mitted by the faid Act for the Free Importation attof; It is enacted, amongst other Things, hat it thall and may be lawful to and for His bigelly, from Time to Time, during the next

expedient to His Majesty so to do) by His Rayal Proclamation to be issued by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, or by his Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, to permit the Free Importation of the Articles aforesaid from any Parts or Flaces in His Majesty's Deminions in America, for any Time or Times until the first Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-eight: And whereas it appears to His Majesty to be expedient at this Time, that the Free Importation of Wheat and Wheat Flour from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America should be surther continued; His Majesty doth therefore hereby Order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Free Importation into Great Britain of Wheat and Wheat Flour by any of His Majesty's Subjects be permitted from any Parts or Places in His Majesty's Dominions in America, in any Ship or Veffel navigated according to Law, from the Expiration of the Time limitted for the Importation thereof by the fiest mentioned Act, until the First Day of February, 1768, under the Regulations and in the Manner mentioned and contained in the faid recited Acts; of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.
