Genoa, August 15.

A Danish ship is arrived from Lisbon with thirty-three expelled Jesuits. The Ship was visited on her Passage by a Barbary Cruizer, and must perform a Quarantine. The Jesuits applied for Leave to go to lay the Quarantine in the Lazaretto, which was refused them; and it was intimated, that they must not to set their Feet ashore in any Part of the Republick's Dominions.

The Master of a Vessel, who is arrived in Six Days from Mahon, brings Advice, that Five Venetian Ships of War were arrived there, with the Venetian Consul, from Algiers, not having been able to renew the Peace between the Republick of Venice and the Dey and Regency, and had declared War against the Algerines.

Copenhagen, August 22. The King has lately presented her Danish Majesty with the Palace and Gardens of Freudenland, situated about three Miles from Copenhagen.

His Majesty reviewed the Corps of Artillery on Wednesday the 19th, in the Island of Almack, and seemed much pleased with the Manner in which they went through their different Evolutions and Firings.

The Sale of the Cargo of the East India Company's Ships from China, which was to be on Monday next, is postponed to the 6th of September, as is that of their Bengal Ship to the 23d.

Compiègne, August 27. Last Sunday his Royal Highness the Dauphin entered into the Fourteenth Year of his Age, and was declared to be out of his Minority.

The Court's Departure from hence is fixed for the 31st Instant.
