And whereas by feveral other Acts passed in the said Session of Parliament, the free Importation into this Kingdom of Wheat or Wheat Flour, Barley, Barley-meal, Peas, Beans, Tares, or Callivancies, Malt, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch; from any Part of Europe, by any Person or Persons, in any Ship or Vessel whatsoever, is permitted until the Tenth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and - And whereas by another Act fixty-feven. passed in the said Session of Parliament, in-titled, "An Act for granting to His Ma-"jesty a certain Sum of Money out of the "Sinking Fund, and for applying certain" " Monies therein mentioned, for the Service of " the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and "Sixty-feven; and for further appropriating the "Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament; " for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of " Money which hath arisen by the Two-sevenths Excile; for empowering His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation of any Sort of Corn or Grain, Duty Free, into this Kingdom, for a longer
Time than is permitted by any Act of this Session of Parliament; and for obviating Doubts, in relation to the Meeting of Com-" missioners for putting in Execution an Act of this Seffion for granting an Aid to His Maight by a Land Tax;"— After reciting the 'lao former Acte, and that it might be expedient, caring the Receis of Parliament, to permit the

Free Importation of the faid Articles mentioned in the faid several Act, into this Kingdom, be-yond the Time limited by the faid Acts for the Free Importation thereof; It is enacted, amongst other Things, That it shall and may be lawful to and for His Majesty, from Time to Time, during the next Receis of Parliament, (whenever it shall appear expedient to His Majesty so to do) by His Royal Proclamation to be issued by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, or by His Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, to permit the Free Importation of all or any the faid Articles and Things, From any Parts or Places in Europe, for any Time or Times until Twenty Days after the Commencement of the next Session of Parlia-- And whereas it appears to His Majesty to be expedient at this Time, that the Free Importation of Oats or Oatmeal, Rye or Ryemeal, Wheat or Wheat Flour, Barley, Barleymeal, Peas, Beans, Tares, or Callivancies, Malt, Bread, B.scuit, and Starch, from any Parts or Places in Europe, should be further continued until Twenty Days after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament-Majesty doth therefore hereby Order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, that the Free Importation into Great Britain of Oats or Oat-meal, Rye or Rye-meal, Wheat or Wheat Flour, Barley, Barley-meal, Peas, Beans, Tares, or Callivancies, Malt, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch, be permitted from any Parts or Places in Europe, in any Ship or Vessel whatsoever, from the Expiration of the respective Times limited by the faid Acts for the Free Importation thereof, un'il Twenty Days after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, under the Regulations and in the Manner mentioned and contained in the said recited A&s --- Of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

" and Wheat Flour;" It is enacted, amongst other Things, That no Person or Persons whatfoever shall, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry, or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed, out of or from the Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be laden or laid on Board, in any Ship, or other Vessel or Boat, in o der to be exported or carried out of the faid Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, with fuch Exceptions and Qualifications as are therein mentioned, any Sort of Corn, Grain, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, or Starch, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the foid Act mentioned, until the Tenth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and fixty-feven. - And whereas by the faid Act His Majesty is authorized and impowered, by His Royal Proclamation to be iffued by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, or by His Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, from Time to Time after the said Tenth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and fixty-seven, and before the next Seffion of Parliament, if the fame should appear expedient to His Majesty, to prohibit the Exportation of all or any of the faid Commodities for any Time or Times until Twenty Days after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament; such Prohibition not to extend to fuch or so much of the said Commodities as are allowed by the faid Act to be exported, under certain Rules and Regulations, to the Places and for the Purpofes therein mentioned.—And whereas it appears to His Ma-jelly to be expedient at this Time that the faid Prohibition should be further continued until Twenty Days after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament --- His Majesty doth therefore hereby order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That no Person or Persons whatsoever shall, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry, or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed, out of or from the said Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be laden or laid on Board, in any Ship, or other Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of the faid Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, any Sort of Corn, Grain, Meal, Mait, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, or Starch, from and after the said Tenth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and fixty-seven, until Twenty Days after the Com-mencement of the next Session of Parliament, under the Penalties an: Forfeitures mentioned in the aforesaid Act; except such or so much of the faid Commedicies as are allowed by the faid Act to be exported, under certain Rules and Regulations, to the Places and for the Purposes therein mentioned. — Of which all Persons concerned are hereby required to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
