His Majesty, for the better discovering and bring-ing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing both, or tither, of the said anonimeus Letters, is hereby thasid to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually curote the said Letters) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, or either of them, so that he, she, or they may be appreciated and convicted thereof. And, as a further Encouragement, I the Said William Rowlandson, of Richmond in the County of York afordaid, to whom the Said anonimous Letters avere directed, do hereby promise a Reward of Twenty Guineas to any Person making such Discovery as afore-soid, (except as above excepted;) to be faid by me upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
