Mosco, Febr. 11. He 8th inffant, about fix a Clock in the afternoon, dyed here our Czar, in the 55 year of his age, and the 9th day of his fickness; that very evening his Son, aged about 16 years, was crowned Czar, and received the Oath of Obedience of all the great Lords and Officers of this Court. The next day at ten in the morning, the deceafed Ozar was Interred, in this manner : Fifth was car-ried a great Canopy richly Embroidered with gold and filver Flowers, and almost covered with Diamonds and Then followed the Patriarch, and the whole Pearls . Clergy, making a most pitiful; moan and lamentation. Then the Corps of the Czar placed in a Sled, covered with red Cloth, and adorned with Diamonds, and other precious floues in great number, was carried by 24 Lords, n xt followed the Empress in a Sled covered with black Cloth ik Mile carried by 24 Lords, behind in the Sled there f tring an ancient Matron, in whole Lap the Empreis laid fier head, then the present Czar placed in a Chair covered with black, carried by fix ancient, Lords, then the Daughters of the decenfed Ozar likewife carti-ed in S'e s, then the Bojars, which are the moff eminent perfohs in this Countrey, and all the Domeiticks as well of the detealed as the prefere Emperor Empres, soft, bea

wailing and lamenting in a molt terrible manner. Cracow, Febr. 24. The Deputies of the Dyet having after feveral long debates concluded the matters which at the first occasioned fome difagreement among them, on Friday last they went, according to cultom, with thein Marefchal or Speaker at the head of them, to prefent themfelves to his Majesty, who received them fitting on his Throne in the Chamber where the Sendrors have their meeting; and having paid their du ies to his Majefly, they by their Speaker prayed he would please to dis-pole of the vacant Benefices and Offices, and that the term of the prefent Sellion mi, ht be limited to 4 weeks, in which two points his Majelly promifed they should have satisfaction. Then the Archbishop of Gnefna, by the Kinss order, acquinted the Deputies with what his Majelty thought ought, chiefty to be the fubject of their confultations during this their meeting, viz, whether it were best to endeavor to make'a Peace with the Turk sof to continue the Wir; if the former, by what means an honourable Peace might be best obtained, and whether the mediation of fome neighbouring Prince were not to be made use of in order to it ; if to continue the War, that they must confult how to put his Majesty in a condition fo to do with honour and advantage to the Crown. This dong, the Emperors and other Foreign Ministers had Audience of the Kirlg, and among others, the Ambaffador of Prance, who then prefented to his Majefty a foleing Declaration of the King his Matter, by which he adopts the Queen of Poland his daughters declaring that accordingly the thall on all occasions be looked upon and treated as a daughter of France.

Vienna, March 8. General Montecuculi is for the most part prefent in the Councils of War than are held here, but continues fo very much indifposed, that it's doubted he will not be able to command the Army this Campagne ; and in fuch cafe it is difcourfed, that his Imperial Majefly will put the command of his Forces into the hands of fome Prince of the Empire. The Empress is now to weak, that her recovery is almost despained of. It is reported that the Elector of *Bavaria* thesar prefent 25000 Men on foot, and that he fill raifes more.

Ratisbonne, March 13. At the inflance of the Emperor, the States affembled here, have refolved to three in the name of the Empire, to the Suiffe Cantons, to delug they would not permit Levies to be made in these Teasift tories for the French lervice. The matter concerning the prohibiting the French Manufactures, is wholly'concluded, viz. That after the publication of this Prohibittion throughout the Empire, which shall be done by his Tinpérial Májelly in the fame manner as hath been already observed in the Hereditary Countries, it shall be free for the Merchants that have any French Manufactures at preferit in their hands, to take a years time to dispose of them ; and that in the mean time all the States of the Empire, and particularly those on the Frontiers shall be required that they take care that no more Foreign Manufactures and Meichandizes be brought into the Empire. We hear that the Prince of Baden Dourlach, General of the Empire, has fent out his orders, that the Troops of she feveral Circles be ready to march by the 20 of this 1.1 month

Stratburgh, March 14,0 The Imperial Troops begin to move, and feveral of them have alteady paffed the Rhine at the auterburgh. The French of Philipsburgh have burne down to the ground Bruchfal, and Beizheimb, in the Country of Ballen. The French we hear are about fending 4000 men to Kallenholts, to maintain the paffage into the valley of Malkirkes and to be fo much nebrer to Schleftadt. We fill believe that they will only act defensively in thefe parts this Summer. Yefterday, and the day before artived here a great quantity of Corn and Mealy which is to be laid up here for the fervice of the Imperialifts, and other confiderable quantities are daily expected from Bohemis for the fame ufe. It was believed that Mijor General Schultz, who has been abroad with a confiderable party, would have attempted fomething upon Deux Ponts, but he advanted no farther than Anweyler, and has again repaffed the Rbine at Lauterburgh.

Eologne, March 17. In all appearance the fharpeft Adtion will be this Summer near the Mofelle. In Treves there is already a Galilon of 7000 Men, and belides we are robal that feveral other Troops are ordered to march thaway. From Strasburgh they write, That the Imperial Troops have already in feveral places quitted their Winter-quarters, and are marching towards the Rhine, We are likewild putting our felves here into a pofture of defende, the Heer Hees, at prefent Governor of the Fortrefs Homburg, is made choice of to command our Tribops, and our Magifirates have refolved to reinforce every Company to 250 men.
