

Hague, October 6. The last Accounts of the Prince of Orange are of his Arrival at Magdebourg in perfect Health and Spirits; and we expect in a Day or two an Account of the Completion of his Marriage, and the Time of their Royal and Serene Highnesses Departure from Berlin towards these Provinces.

St. James's, October 2, 1767.

 “ so minde your Self”

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing both, or either, of the said anonymous Letters, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually wrote the said Letters) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, or either of them, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
