Proclamations, to be iffued by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, or by His or Their Order in Council, to be published in the London Gazette, from Time to Time to prohibit the Making, Extracting, or Distilling, of any Kind of Low Wines or Spirits from any Wheat, Barley, Malr, and any other Sort of Grain, and from Meal, Flour, and Bran, or any Mixture therewith, for any Time or Times during fuch Recess, or until Twenty Days after the Commencement of the then next seffion of Parliament. – -And whereas His Majesty hath received Information, That the Price of Wheat in the Port of London, has been, for Two fuccessive Market Days, above Forty-eight Shillings the Quarter, Winchester Measure.

His Majetty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby prohibit the Making, Extracting, or Distilling, of any Kind of Low Wines or Spirits from any Wheat, Wheat Meal, Wheat Flour, and Wheat Bran, or any Mixture therewith, from the Date hereof, until Fourteen Days after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament.all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and yield due Obedience to His Majesty's Commands hereby fignified.
