**L**AST Night the Body of his late Royal Highness Edward Duke of York and Albany was privately interred in the Royal Vault in King Henry the Seventh's Chapel at Westminster, the Body having been conveyed to the Prince's Chamber the Night before. Between Nine and Ten the Procession began to move, passing through the Old Palace Yard to the South East Door of Westminster Abbey, upon a Floor railed in, covered with Black Cloth, and lined on each Side with a Party of the Foot Guards, in the following Order :

Drums and Trumpets founding a solemn March, with Banners attached to them, adorned with Naval Trophies, the Drums covered with Black.



At the Entrance of Westminster Abbey, within the Church, the Dean and Prebendaries, attended by the Choir, received the Body, falling into the Procession next before Norroy King of Arms, and so proceeded, singing, into King Henry the Seventh's Chapel; where the Coffin was placed on Tressels, the Head towards the Altar, the Crown and Cushion being laid thereon, and the Canopy held over it, while the Service was read by the Dean of Westminster; the Chief Mourner and his two Supporters sitting on Chairs at the Head of the Corpse, the Lords Affistants and Supporters of the Pall upon Stools on either Side.

The Part of the Service before the Interment being read, the Corpse was deposited in the Vault; and the Dean having finished the Burial Service, Garter King of Arms proclaimed his Royal Highness's Stile as follows:

Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory Life unto His Divine Mercy, the late most High, most Mighty, and most Illustrious Prince, EDWARD-AUGUSTUS, Duke of York and Albany, Earl of Ulster, Knight of the most Noble Order of the Garter, Second Son of the late most Illustrious Prince FREDERICK Prince of Wales deceased, and next Brother to his most Excellent Majesty GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith; Whom God bless and preserve with long Life, Health, and Honour, and all Worldly Happiness.

*Stockholm, October 20.* The Royal Family returned last Friday to Dronningholm, and the Senate was assembled there Yesterday.

*Hague, October 30.* This Day the Prince and Princess of Orange arrived at the House in the Wood; their Serene and Royal Highnesses came Yesterday from Loo to Soesdyk, which is within Six or Seven Miles of Utrecht: They were received in Ceremony and entertained this Morning by the States of Utrecht in their Passage through that Town; and they were likewise complimented by the Town of Leyden, where the Burghers were under Arms to line the Streets, and all the Houses illuminated: It is not yet known when their Highnesses will receive the Compliments here upon their Arrival; nor is the Day of the Publick Entry into this Town yet fixed: In the mean while the Croud increases here from all Parts, to testify their Joy upon this Occasion.

*Hague, November 3.* Every Day since the Prince and Princess of Orange's Arrival has been taken up with the Reception of the Deputations from all the Colleges of the Government in general, as well as from every particular Province, and every Town in Holland. These Ceremonies will be ended this Week, and at the Beginning of the next, the Prince and Princess will make their Publick Entry into this Town, for which every Thing is preparing. The States of Holland, at their Audience, presented the Princess of Orange with an Annuity of 20,000 Florins per Annum.
