**C**OUNT Cronstedt is made President of the Chamber of Revision, in the room of the late M. Vult-von Stevereh.

*Copenhagen, October 31.* An Ordinance has just been published, by which an additional Duty is laid upon all imported Laithe s, except those of Russia. The Duties now are 2 Rix-Dollars 40 Schillings upon each Degger consisting of ten Skins, and one Rix-Dollar and an half on each dressed Skin.

*Hague, November 10.* Yesterday Noon the Prince and Princess of Orange made their publick Entry into this Town. The Proceffion was very magnificent, and in great Order, notwithstanding the prodigious Affluence of People, which had crowded from all Part: of this Country to see it. The Magistrates of the Hague received and complimented their Highnesses under a triumphal Arch, erected at the Side they came into Town by. The Burghers were under Arms, as was likewise the Garrison; and the Prince of Weilbourg and Prince Lewis of Brunswick marched in the Train at the Head of their respective Squadrons of Guards. The Artillery was fired at the same Time from the Ramparts; the Beils rung; and the Stadtholder, with his Royal Bride, were conducted to their Apartments amidst the Acclamations of the People. The whole Town was magnificently illuminated at Night; and, notwithstanding the prodigious Crowd, not the least Disorder or Accident happened. This Evening their Highnesses make their Appearance, for the first Time, at the Franch Theatre; and on Thursday next the Prince of Orange will give a Ball and Supper at the Old Court, with which the publick Festival will conclude.

Dublin, November 7.

Last Wednesday being the Anniversary of the glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower: At Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant: After which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Proceffion round the Statue of King William: The Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side: And after his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery, in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix, were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in College Green: And the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. And the following Day being

the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phœnix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and the Evening concluded with Illuminations, Bonfires, and other Demonstrations of Joy.
