*Vienna, November 4.*

**T**HE Archduchess Elizabeth is as well as can be expected, but the Physicians, out of Excess of Precaution, will not declare her Royal Highness out of Danger till the 17th Day: However To Decem is appointed to be sung To-morrow for her perfect Recovery.

*Madrid, November 5.* On Sunday last this Court received the melancholy News of the Death of the Archduchess, who was betrothed to the King of Naples, and are gone into Mourning on this Account for three Weeks.

Yesterday being the Feast of St. Charles, his Catholick Majesty's Name-day, there was a Befamens at Court, and many of the Nobility went from hence to the Escorial to pay their Compliments.

*Dresden, November 8.* Last Wednesday, being Prince Charles late Duke of Courland's Name-day, the Electoral Family went to celebrate the same at Pönitz. The Nobility and Foreign Ministers repaired thither in the Afternoon to pay their Compliments on the Occasion. The Night concluded with a great Supper and Ball, and the Palace and Gardens were illuminated in a most splendid and pleasing Manner.

*Hague, November 13.* Yesterday the Prince of Orange gave a great Ball and Supper at the House called the Old Court, at which were present near Two Thousand Guests. The States of Holland separated To-day; and the Strangers from the different Provinces and Towns are beginning to return home.
