**L**AST Night the Ceremony of the Christening of the young Prince was performed in the Great Council Chamber by the Lord Bishop of London: His Royal Highness was named Edward: The Sponsors were, his Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Brunswick, represented by the Earl of Hertford, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household; his Serene Highness Prince Charles of Mecklenburgh Strelitz, represented by the Earl of Huntingdon, Groom of the Stole; and her Royal Highness the Landgravine of Hesse-Cassel, represented by the Dutches of Hamilton, one of the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bedchamber.
