Stockholm, November 10.

THE Court is returned to this Place; and Yesterday Morning the King and Prince Royal appeared in the Senate.

Vienna, November 18. A few Days ago died here General Pretlach, who had been formerly Ambassador from this Court to that of Peterbourg. His Regiment is given to Count Caramelli, a Piemontese in this Service; and his Government of Ostend to General Diassaffa, Inspector General of Cavalry, and one of the Members of the Council of War.

On Saturday next her Imperial Majesty will go to Presbourg, and pass a few Days there with Prince Albert and the Archdutchess, for the Sake of the Air, and to change the Scene after such a Course of Affliction, Anxiety, and Confinement.

Dresden, November 25. Great Preparations are making here for the Celebration of Prince Xavier's Name-day, which falls on the 2d of next Month. In the Little Theatre belonging to the Court, a serious Italian Opera will be performed on that Occasion; both the Poetry and Musick of which are composed by the Electress Dowager.

Hague, November 24. Prince Lewis of Brunswick gave a magnificent Ball and Supper last Night to the Prince and Princess of Orange; at which were present the Prince and Princess of Weilbourg, Prince William of Baden-Durlach, the Foreign Ministers, and a great Number of Persons of Distinction of both Sexes.

Hague, December 1. The Dutch East India Company have had the Misfortune to lose the last homeward bound Ship from Batavia which was expected this Year. The Ship was wrecked within Three Leagues of the Texel, in a Storm a few Nights ago; and, except Five or Six Sailors, the Whole was lost, amongst whom were several Passengers, whose Names are not yet known.

The King has been pleased to grant unto George Cooke and Thomas Townshend the Younger, Esqrs. the Office of Receiver and Paymaster-General of all His Majesty's Guards, Garrisons, and Land Forces, (Those employed or to be employed by His Majesty for the Service in Ireland, the Marine Regiments, and such Regiments or Forces as are or shall be under the Care and Direction of the High Admiral of Great Britain, or Commissioners of the Admiralty, for the Time being, always excepted:) And also the Office of Paymaster of all the Monies appointed, or set apart, for the Maintenance of the disabled and superannuated Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers belonging to His Majesty's Royal Hospital near Chelsea.
