Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforesaid; such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before tome other Justice; and if it shall sppear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Person shall retuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convict upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpoles aforefaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majetty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Off-nces shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23d. George Ild. Chap. 13.

IF any Persons shall contract with, or endeayour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great-Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland; or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the common Gaol of the Country or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forseiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forseit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOU-SAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for I'wo Years, and until such Forseiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manusactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of

Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wnerein no Estoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, and for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His M.jesty's Warehouses, all such Tools in Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vest I not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Molety of the Produce shall be to the U e of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall leize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the feld Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Pools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Capain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forseit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Expring of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall torfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as af refaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majetty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the
