HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Wills Earl of Hillsborough, and Thomas Viscount Warrmouth, to be Two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; Their Lordships were, this Day, by His Majesty's Command, sworn His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

*Copenhagen, January 2.* The Queen Mother has been so much indisposed for some Days past at Hirschholm, that all her Physicians have been obliged to attend her constantly; they were for some Time apprehensive that her Majesty's Disorder would prove fatal; but there are now Hopes that the Danger is over.

The Fredensburg Slot, Captain Swanne, belonging to this East-India Company, failed from hence on Wednesday last; she is bound to Canton.

*Vienna, January 6.* Last Friday being New-Year's Day, the only Gala that is now observed here, the Emperor, the Empress-Queen, all the Archdukes and Archduchesses, except the Archduchess Elizabeth) as well as the Duke of Saxe Teschen, dined together in Publick. In the Morning the Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers and principal Nobility, had the Honour of paying their Compliments to their Imperial Majesties, and the rest of the Royal Family, and in the Evening there was a Drawing-room.

*Vienna, January 9.* Last Thursday the Court, with a great Suite, went through the principal Streets and Squares of the Town, en Traineaux. It is an Amusement peculiar to this Country, at least with the Parade and Magnificence that is exhibited here on these Occasions, and forms a most singular and striking Sight.

*Florence, January 9.* On the 24th past, a Convoy of nine Transports and two Neapolitan Corbets with many Jesuits from Sicily, was dispersed near Civita-Vecchia; they were bound to the Presidium of Tuscany, from whence the Jesuits were to be accompanied by the Neapolitan Troops to that Part of the Confines of the Ecclesiastical State, called the Patrimoine de St. Pierre.

*Bonn, January 15.* Yesterday Advice was received that the Elector of Trier died the 12th Instant, at Seven in the Evening.
