Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, That, at a Meeting of a great Number of Silk-Weavers and Manufacturers, held on the 21st Instant, (whose Names are under-mentioned) it had been unanimously resolved and determined, that the Prices, which they have hitherto paid, and do at present pay, for making their respective Silks, (and which they have in no wise reduced, or intended to reduce) are the full and just Prices, which can, or ought to be paid for the making of the same; and that therefore no advanced Price will be paid to any Journeyman, or other Person or Persons, for the Manufacturing or Making any of their respective Works, upon any Pretence whatsoever: In order therefore to put a Stop, for the Future, to the many outrageous Proceedings committed by these Persons called by the Name of the Cutters, and to bring to Justice any one or more of these Journeyman Workmen, or others, who shall, at any Time hereafter, wilfully cut to Pieces, damnify, or destroy, any Silk, or any Work-Utensils, or Materials, of, or belonging to the said several Manufacturers, or any of them, His Majesty is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the

Offenders, (except such Person, or Persons, as shall so actually cut, damnify, or destroy, any of the said Works, Silk, Utensils, or Materials) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof. SHEL BURN E.

And as a farther Encouragement, we the under-mentioned Silk-Weavers and Manufacturers do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons, (except as before excepted) who shall make such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders, by our Attorney and Solicitor T.
