The King of Denmark bestowed several Marks of Favour on this happy Occasion. M. Vander Luhe was invested with the Order of the Elephant: Count Holck, elder Brother of the Marshal, and the Chamberlain Schavaliczky, had that of Dannebrone: The Counts of Ahlefeld, Moltke, and M. Lerche, were raifed to the Rank of Chamberlain.
