

Whitehall, February 20, 1768.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Friday Night the 29th of January last, one of the Keepers of Windsor Forest, and one of the Keepers Men, saw three Men, with Horses, and two or three more on Foot, belonging to the same Gang, carrying two Deer on their Horses, and slipping their Dogs at another Deer, in the Sight of Isaac Knight, one of the said Men; and, upon his enquiring what Business they had there, their Answer was, with many Imprecations, That they would knock his Brains out. In Consequence of which Threatening, he retired; and they followed him almost up to Cranbourn, and fired at him at about Forty Yards Distance: After which he summoned another Keeper or two, and went in Pursuit of them, and tracked them to Water Oakley, by the Blood of the Deer they had killed: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons therein concerned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually fired at the said Isaac Knight) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; and also a Reward of Fifty Pounds to any Person making such Discovery; to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offender:
