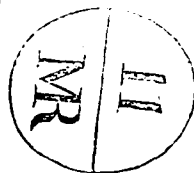

 “ may expect to hear of it in a dreadfull manner
 “ I hope my Poverty will excuse this. Though I
 “ Date this from Dublin, Yet will I be over long
 “ with it and give you warning not to trifle wth. me
 “ for I shall find mean^s. to come very near y^r Person
 “ and shall know whether you deal cadidly with
 “ me or not. Please to leave the above as directed
 “ on the 1st of April next, otherwise abide the Con-
 “ sequences.
