After this, the Great Duke preceded the Great Dutchess to the Chapel of the Court, to which her Royal Highness, with the young Prince on her Lap, was carried in a rich Sedan Chair, and was attended by the Grand Maitresse and the Ladies of Honor. On her Return from thence, the and the Great Duke received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and permitted their Subjects to kiss their Hands, which is a Ceremony that is repeated on all publick Occa-fions. They afterwards dined in publick, and in the Evening there was a great Drawing-Room.
