*Constantinople, March 2.*

**W**E are informed from Cairo, that Ali Beg had got rid of ten other powerful Enemies, viz. Four Beks, two of which were killed in the Night of the 1st of December, one Chaous, and the third Audobachi of the Odegak of the Janisaries, two Kiaia's, and one Charbagi of the Porte of the Arabs, and the Chaoufser Kiaiaffi, who were all banished the next Day. By Means of this Expulsion Ali Beg has rendered himself formidable, having besides caused five of his Creatures to be chosen Beks, the better to maintain his Power.

*Florence, April 2.* The Great Duke and Dutchess performed the Ceremony, on Holy Thursday, of washing the Feet and serving the Poor at Table as usual. The Great Duke, on Foot, attended by his whole Court, visited the Sepulchres in Seven Churches; but the Weather not being very good, the Great Dutchess did not go out.

*Vienna, April 6.* The Pope's Nuntio made his Entry last Monday, and had his Audiences Yesterday, that he might be in Publick in order to be able to perform the Marriage Ceremony Tomorrow. The Archduke Ferdinand will be the King of Naples's Proxy. The Queen of Naples will set out a few Hours after.

Yesterday the Neapolitan Ambassador went to Court with a great Retinue, and had an Audience of their Imperial Majesties to demand her Royal Highness; after which she was betrothed with the usual Ceremonies. To-day her Royal Highness signed and swore to the Act of Renunciation of all Pretensions to Allodials, &c. and every Claim whatever, in the Form that has always been practised on these Occasions.

The Viscount della Herreria, the Spanish Minister at the Court of Petersburg, arrived here a few Days ago in his Way to Madrid, whither he has obtained Leave to return for a short Time.
