Whitehall, April 30, 1768.

IT being His Majesty's Royal Intention, that the Parliament, which is summoned to meet on Tuesday the 10th Day of May next, should then meet and sit; The King has been pleased to direct a Commission to pass the Great Seal, appointing and authorising his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, Thomas Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and other Lords, to open and hold the said Parliament on the said 10th Day of May next, being the Day of the Return of the Writs of Summons.

Vienna, April 13. The Queen of Naples sat out last Thursday Afternoon, about Four o'Clock.

The Emperor was pleased, on the Marriage, to make a Promotion of about Thirty Chambellans.

Next Sunday Evening is fixed for the Emperor's Departure; and the Duke of Saxe Teschin, as Commander in Chief in Hungary, will accompany him: His Imperial Majesty will travel with a very small Retinue, and will perform the greatest Part of the Tour, after the second Day's Journey, on Horseback. The Persons, that have the Honour to attend him, are, his Grand Ecuyer Count Dietrichstein, Marshal Lacy, and the Generals Loudon, Joseph Colorado and Nostitz. Small Parties are ordered from the Regiments of Horse that are quartered in these Parts, to escort his Imperial Majesty in the greatest Part of his Tour.

The Publick will be entertained To-morrow with a Sight quite new in this Part of the World, which is the Launching of a Twenty Gun Frigate, that has been some Time building at Closter Newbourg, half a German Mile up the Danube.

His Highness Prince George of Mecklenbourg Strelitz is just arrived here in perfect Health.

Phipps and Everard, of Artillery-Lane, the Damage whereof amounts nearly to the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds upon the most moderate Computation: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Outrages, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of them, who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
