Whitehall, April 30, 1768.

IT being His Majesty's Royal Intention, that the Parliament, which is summoned to meet on Tuesday the 10th Day of May next, should then meet and sit; The King has been pleased to direct a Commission to pass the Great Seal, appointing and authorising his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, Thomas Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and other Lords, to open and hold the said Parliament on the said 10th Day of May next, being the Day of the Return of the Writs of Summons.

Copenhagen, April 16. Yesterday M. de Brandt, a Gentleman of the Bed-Chamber to the King of Denmark, was married to Mademoiselle Scheel, Dame d'Honneur to the Queen: The Ceremony, as is customary, was performed in the Presence of their Danish Majesties: As soon as it was over, the Bridegroom had the Key of Chamberlain given him. The same Mark of Distinction was conferred on Baron Rantzau.

Copenhagen, April 23. On Wednesday last Count Holck, Marshal of the Court, was married to Mademoiselle Stockfleter: And on the same Day the intended Marriage between M. Levitzou and the Countess Holck, Sister to the Marshal, was declared.

Stockholm, April 19. The Royal Family came to Town last Wednesday, and To-morrow there will be a Court for the first Time since the Holidays.

Vienna, April 20. His Highness the Prince of Mecklenbourg went last Saturday Morning to Neusiedle in Hungary, about three Posts from hence, where his Regiment is quartered.

The Empress-Queen and Part of the Imperial Family will remove next Friday to Schonbrun, and the Beginning of May the whole Court will go to Laxembourg.

Hague, May 3. On Thursday next the Horse Guards, commanded by the Prince of Weillbourg, and the Foot Guards by Prince Lewis of Brunswick, are to be reviewed; as will on Friday the Dragoon Guards, commanded by General Maasdam, and the Swiss Guards by Major General Sandoz. On Saturday the Life Guards, of which Prince Lewis is Captain, will be reviewed; and there will be a general Review this Month, which will continue Four Days.
