Westminster, May 10, 1768.

THIS Day the new Parliament met; and His Majesty's Commission, empowering Thomas Archbishop of Canterbury, Charles Lord Camden, Chancellor of Great Britain, Charles Earl Gower, President of His Majesty's Council, and several other Lords therein named, to open and hold the said Parliament, was read in the Presence of both Houses. And the Commons were directed to choose their Speaker, and to present him Tomorrow, at Twelve o'Clock at Noon, to the Lords Commissioners.

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to Order the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor to issue Writs for Proroguing the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Friday the Thirteenth of this Instant May, to Friday the Twenty-second Day of July next.

Florence, April 23. The Great Duke, attended by Count Rosenberg, is to set out the Day after To-morrow for Bologna, to meet the Queen of Naples, and to conduct her hither. Count Rosenberg is to have the Honour of entertaining her Majesty at Pietra Mala, the Confinies of this State. The Great Dutchess remains in the Palace to receive her, and an Intimation has been given to the Nobility of both Sexes to be at Court that Evening in Gala to wait for the Queen's Arrival.

The Pope's Nuncio here had a formal Audience Yesterday of the Great Duke, to which he was conducted in a Coach and Six of the Court, and was attended by three others of his own. The Great Duke received him with all the Ceremony that is practised when Nuncios make their Publick Entry, which is always deferred till they are near their Departure. He had afterwards an Audience of the Great Dutchess in the same Manner.

Florence, April 26. The Great Duke sat out Yesterday for Pietra Mala, the Confinies of this State, from whence, as this Morning, he was to go to Bologna to meet the Queen of Naples, and on Wednesday Evening, though probably very late, they will arrive here: The Great Dutchess is to have a Drawing-Room that Evening in the Apartment destined for the Queen, where the Nobility of both Sexes have had Orders to attend.

Vienna, April 23. The Queen of Naples is safely arrived as far as Inspruck.

Vienna, April 27. The last Accounts of the Emperor were from Arrad, where his Imperial Majesty arrived the 22d Instant in perfect Health, as well as the Duke of Saxe-Teschén, and the Persons that have the Honor to attend him.

The Prince of Mecklenbourg arrived here last Sunday, and has since been declared Colonel in Second to the Arch-Duke Leopold's Regiment of Cuirassiers: His Highness will set out again To-morrow for Neu Siedel, and from thence will go in a few Days to his new Quarters near Presbourg.

Munich, April 28. Both their Electoral Highnesses have been a good deal indisposed with Colds, which have not however prevented them from pursuing their favourite Diversion of Hunting. His Serene Highness the Duke of Bavaria has been and is still much indisposed with the same Complaint, which has been epidemical in this Country. The whole Court remove next Week to the Palace of Nymphembourg, which is preparing for their Reception.

Brussels, May 6. On Wednesday last his Royal Highness the Prince went to Terveuren for the Summer Season.
