UPON Opening of the Matter this present Day unto the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, by Mr. Attorney-General, being of Council with the Plaintiffs, it was alleged, that the Plaintiffs, on the 23d Day of February last, filed their Bill in this Court against the Defendant, as by the Six Clerks Certificate appears, and took out Process of Subpœna, requiring him to appear to and answer the Plaintiffs Bill; that the Defendant is gone to and remains in the Kingdom or Spain, to elude the Justice and avoid the Process of this and other Courts of Judicature in this Kingdom, as by the Affidavit of the Plaintiff and Thomas D'La Hunt, Gentleman, appears; and the said Certificate and Affidavit being read; His Lordship doth order, that the Defendant do appear to the Plaintiffs' Bill on or before the First Day of Trinity Term next.
