*Petersbourg, May 3.*

**T**HE Empress is not yet returned from Sarkoe-Zelo, where she celebrated her Birth-Day. Her Imperial Majesty on that Day invested the Count Alexis Orlow with the Order of St. Andrew.

*Naples, May 9.* To-morrow his Sicilian Majesty will go to Gaëta, and on Thursday Morning his Majesty is to meet the Queen and the Great Duke and Dutchess at Portella, when they are to proceed together in the same Coach to Caserta.

Foreigners from every Quarter flock in here daily, among whom are Lord Carlisle, Lord Fitzwilliam, Mr. Dashwood, &c.

*Berlin, May 21.* This Morning the Regiments that compose this Garrison, viz. Coschembart, Lotteim, Prince Frederick of Brunswick, Steinkeller, Ramin, Bulow, and Renzel, Infantry; the Gens d'Armes; and the Regiment of Zeithen, Hussars; together with those of Prince Henry and Prince Ferdinand, the King of Prussia's Brothers, Prince William of Brunswick, Duringshoven, and Wimsiek, Infantry; the late Prince Henry, Cuirassiers; and the Gardes du Corps; were review'd and manœuvred before his Prussian Majesty upon the Heights of Tempelhoff, about halt a German Mile distant from this Place, to the entire Satisfaction of that Monarch.

His late Majesty having been graciously pleased, by his Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are to give Notice, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth; as also with the Clerks of the Checque at Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheerness; and with the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where all such Widows as intend to lay in their Claims, may be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Purpose. But such Widows as live at too great a Distance from the Places above-mentioned, may apply by Letter to Mr. Beljon, at the

Admiralty-Office, who will send them all necessary Information. And the Governors of the said Charity intending to distribute to the Widows of Sea-Officers who died before the 30th of August, 1732, as well as to the Widows of those who died since that Time, whose Circumstances come within the Rules of the Establishment, such Monies as may be due to them on the 31st of May instant; This is to give Notice, that any Widows who have not yet applied, and intend to lay in their Claims, may do so as soon as possible; and that all such Widows, whose Claims have been already allowed, may send or bring to this Office, as soon as possible, the Affidavits required by the Rules, in order to their being continued upon the Pension or Bounty.

 “ a loade to the mellers or poore people from this  
 “ Day Forward on the 30 day of May will Have it  
 “ without Money or price and that meller ho give  
 “ a bove 10 Pound a Loade shall shourly have  
 “ his mill nocked down all poore men are desired  
 “ to meet at woodchurch green on 30 day of May  
 “ to raise a mob and whosoever refuses to come shall  
 “ hav his writ Arme broke.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in Writing and Fixing up the said Incendiary Paper, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the same) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
