THE Prince Administrator, the Elector, and the Electress Dowager, went on Tuesday last to Pilitz for the Summer Season.

Hague, June 7. The Prince and Princess of Orange went on Saturday last from Amsterdam to Utrecht by Water, and from thence to Soefdyck, where their Highnesses were in good Health by the last Accounts, and from thence they are to go to Loo, where the King of Prussia is to be on Monday next.

The States-General have sent a Deputation, which sat out this Morning, to compliment his Prussian Majesty at Wesel: The Members who compose it are, Baron Lynden tot Hemmon, Baron D'Ablaing de Giessenbourg, Count Wafsenae Twickel, and M. Huydecooper de Marfeven, one of the Deputies of Amsterdam.

“ Mr. Dorlo you and Maor Make game of the Letter you had on Sunday But God D-m your

[Price Three-Pence.]

“ Blouds if we Done Set Fire to all your thee Houses that Damd Son of a Bich Sharp shall Feal our Resentiment furst as he has got one at work the furst Day the new one Comes Out Dam your Blouds. Take Care ”

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing both the said anonymous threatening incendiary Letters, or either of them, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote both or either of the said Letters) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Facts, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
