is come to Dendermondi, and upon the orfiom his Excellency, 300 Horfe marched fin the afternoon, to join the Duke de monwith 400 Hoxie, and 400 Eoor, had pofted
t Loc ercn; but it feems he was forced to quit a . on and to re ite, upon the approach of the Enewo m ruhed in Body, and had feveral piaces of n when on the other fide he had none. The next he ranabic continued to burn feveral Villages, and $\rho$ lait made an agreement of Contribution, viz. That the countrey of Wias fhall pay 300000 Gilders. This day ar Noon 33 Troops of Horfe, under the command of the Counc de Nancte, arearlived at Wetteren on the Schelde, between this place and Dendermonde, having wih them a grear many Wagons. They have laid a Bridge over the River.

Ditto, April 17. We have already told you, that the Duke of Montalto, who it feems was accompanied with the Prince of Vaudemont, the Marquis de Confans, and feveral other Perfons of' Quality, had polted himfelf on Monday laftat Locberen, having with him his Excellencies Guards of Horfe, three Companies of Dragoons, and as many of Foot, to oppofe the farther progrefs of the French into the Countrey of Waes; but it feems thefe Troops were nor fufficient to make head againft the Enemy, who edme ayainit them 7000 ftrong, with the advantage ot feveral pieces of Cannon, whichours wanted; wheretore the Duke de Montalio, after fome skirmilh, in which the Count de Ville, and about 30 of the Guards, with one of their Lieutenants werekilled, and another Lieutennt taken Prifoner, thought fit to retire in fome hafte towards Dexdermonde; which bad he nor timely done, he and all his men bad been cut off by the French, who came marching upon their backs, and already appeared in fight. The French polted themfelves at Lo teren, where they contintued tillWednelday, dur ring which time they burnt part of Locheren, and finally made ath agreenent, that the Countrey of Waes Thould pay a yearly Contribution of 50000 Crowns,and 100000 Crowns at the prefent for the time paft and for an affurance of pryment hereof they took wi h them the grant Baylifftand 40 her principal Perfons,as Hoftages. Befides this great Contribution, 10 Villages have been burnt to the goound; and we are told that the lofs thereby,as well as what the French have carried away, amounts ro five Millions of Gilders. On Wednefday thofe Troopsthan were leff to guard che Pals ac Rinne, having joined their main Body ar Zocieren, they all decampeds and mardbed to Wrtteren on the Schelde between Ghent and Brudermande, (wherer the Count de Nanire expocted rhemwith a Bodydor Horfe, having brought with hime a gteat many Wagonsto carry off cheir Booty) and haring paffed the Schelde there, are recurfitd hamé, is

Brufists, April 37. Yefterday arrived here the Duke de tsontatics, and the Rrience de Vaudemonts ant having it feensbeen ftrong eaough tbattempt any thing upon the Eroncle, lin their returm nut of the Country of Waes; and this evening bis Excollency is likewife returned to Town. All the netws we have had for thefe 4 or 5 days, is, thate ehe Ercanh were going to befiege Ipres, and that they had atready inveltert is ; but this day we have advice, that tle french Forces are marching towards Conde. This day the Prince of Orange breaks up from Rofenlael, and marches this way. The Molt Chivitian Hing is come into Elanders.
 Admata mofiafres from Ruy watn, where he had been to recenve his fiafd dispotches from his Highnefs, being appointed to go
out with 12 Men of War, to Cruife in the Notth-fea, to fe cure our Trade and Navigation agannt the Privateers of Dune knt. The sicur $M y$ wrooment the Danifh minifter here is gone for sm fitadam, to haten the Equipage of the Men of War defigned for tie Balcick; of which $\& 2$ are ready to pafs che Pampios, as sha ocher thres will de very fuddenly, The Heer Trump has rakenthis leave ofinche sitrtes, and of all the Perfons of Qua lit, here, and is gone for Anfferdam, incending to take his palfage for Denmark in the Men of War aboveninentioned. From Flanders we have an account of the Freach having fallen into the Countrey of Waes, and of the great damage they have done there.

Paris, April 18. On Thuriday laft bis Majefty parted from St Gurmins towards Flanders, to command his Army in perfon. Yefterday his Majefty Indged at Mondicier, and will be this day at $P_{\text {tronne. }}$ From Life we have advice of the Marefchal de Humberes having with 28 Squadrons of Horfe, ahd 10 Batr2liens of Foot, fallien into the countrey of Waes, and fet that whole Countrey under Contribution.
Toaryay, Aprulis. The french Troops have for thefe is days palt been drawing togecher in the plain of Lifle, and at the fame time a grear many Cannon, and great quantities of Bulkets, \&rc. were put on Board Keveral Veffels appointed for that purpofe, to be Tranfported as there fhould be occalion. Some few dayes fiace, the Troops chat were there, received orders to march, as they accordingly dad, and went and encamped near a place called cumires, upon the River Lys, about two Leagues from Ipres, which gave us an opinion that that place would be befieged. The $\mathrm{I}_{4}$ inftant, as we undertand from $L$ ife, the Marecthal de Rochefort, and the Marquis de Louvoy arrived there, but parted again the nigbt following: And yefterday morning the Forces that lay at Comines, decamped from thence, and marched this way; and we are told that yeflerday like wife matched from $L_{i} f_{c}$ above 60 Wagons laden with Shovels, Pickaxes, fe. followed with a great company of Pioneers and Catpenters, they continuing their march all laft nighe and this day, having with them valt quantities of Forage for the fubm fiftence of the Cavalty, the Grafs being as yer too low. In the mean tume the Marefchal de Crequi is arrived at Pont a Boxyines with 14 or 15000 Men; and yefterday the Marefchal $d^{2} \mathrm{Hu}$ mieres, whois returned from fetting the Countrey of waes una der Contribution, joined with the Marelchal Crequi, as the Forceş chat came from cumions have likewife done ; all the difconrie here is, that Valenciennes will be befieged, but firft onde, for the Army marches that way, and the repors goes that cuede is "already invefted. The King will be rhis night in $\mathcal{A}$ ras, and $t 0$ morrow will be with his Army, which will confift in abouc 45000 Men , and be conmanded under the King by five Marefchals, viz. Crequi, la Feullade, Hamieres, Scbomlerg, and de Lorge.
